A rebrand was introduced presenting a new logo that symbolizes the strength and longevity of the Plan. This represents the continual commitment of customer service to our audience – employees and employers.

The Plan continued to grow as assets, plan memberships and participating employers all saw an increase in numbers.

To encourage new members and current ones to take ownership of their pension and financial

future, a half-day workshop, "*Your Pension, Your Future*," was implemented for members in their 20's and 30's. To keep up with the changing environment of pensions, a digital strategy is being developed to further engage members.

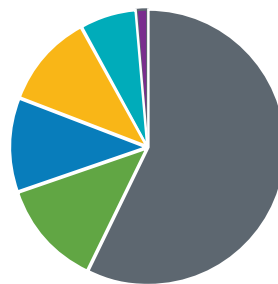

MEPP had 309 members retire in 2015 compared to 332 members in 2014.

In 2015, MEPP made pension payments to 5,200 pensioners, paying approximately \$63.7 million; compared to 5,000 pensioners who received approximately \$59.0 million in pension payments in 2014.
